MirNs FIELD TRIP

This exciting field trip offers a Zoom multi-media tour of the MirNs exhibition + a pre-activity video + a live art workshop taught over Zoom. Explore innovative approaches to portraiture and how machines 'see', through machine learning, mimicry & robotics. The workshop will introduce students to Mask-making through Augmented Reality (AR). Exercises will encourage critical thinking and how we create meaning through art. Students will use SparkAR to make their own virtual portrait masks. Masks throughout history have had powerful symbolic, cultural and poetic associations. This theme can be a great supplement to curriculum subjects in Indigenous Learning, History, Science and Social Sciences. CLICKABLE INTERACTIVE ART: INTRO TO UX

In this workshop you will learn the basics of User Experience design and create an interactive artwork you can view on a computer or mobile device. 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COVID-19 HISTORICAL DOCUMENTATION

The New Westminster Museum and Archives is documenting Covid-19 pandemic in New Westminster and reaching out to community members to collect both physical objects and digital documentation, and thus document history as it happens. FIRST PEOPLES OF THE NORTHWEST COAST

This fun and interactive virtual program will educate students on local Indigenous people's technology, trade and relationship with nature in the past and present, as well as the changes that occurred due to colonization.
